Unlike the visible planets, these lunar nodes are shadow planets that symbolize karmic forces, spiritual evolution, illusion, detachment, obsession, and transformation. In marital astrology, the influence of Rahu and Ketu becomes highly significant because marriage itself is considered a karmic institution in Sanatana Dharma. The placement of these nodes in the horoscope can create disturbances, misunderstandings, emotional instability, unconventional unions, delayed marriages, separations, or deep spiritual partnerships depending upon their dignity, house placement, conjunctions, aspects, and planetary strengths. This journal explores the concept of Rahu–Ketu Dosha in relation to marriage life according to classical Vedic astrology principles. Rahu represents desire, obsession, ambition, illusion, material craving, and unconventionality, while Ketu symbolizes detachment, renunciation, spirituality, dissatisfaction, and past-life karma. When these nodes influence the 7th house, Venus, Moon, or Navamsa, they may generate what astrologers commonly call “Rahu–Ketu Dosha” in marriage. Such combinations can create disturbances in married life, emotional confusion, intercaste marriages, hidden relationships, lack of trust, delayed marriage, sudden separations, or spiritual transformation through partnerships. However, Rahu and Ketu should not always be feared. In many cases, they create extraordinary growth, cross-cultural unions, spiritual marriages, and powerful karmic evolution. Their results depend upon the overall horoscope and planetary strengths.

2. Mythological Origin of Rahu & Ketu

The mythology of Rahu and Ketu originates from the Samudra Manthana (Churning of the Ocean) described in the Bhagavata Purana and Vishnu Purana. During the churning of the cosmic ocean, the devas and asuras sought amrita, the nectar of immortality. Lord Vishnu distributed the nectar among the devas while disguising Himself as Mohini. An asura named Swarbhanu secretly sat among the devas and consumed the nectar. However, the Sun and Moon identified him and informed Lord Vishnu. Vishnu immediately severed Swarbhanu’s head with the Sudarshana Chakra. Since the nectar had already touched him, he did not die. Instead, his head became Rahu and the remaining body became Ketu. This myth symbolizes duality within human consciousness. Rahu represents the head without the body — endless desire without satisfaction. Ketu represents the body without the head — spiritual liberation without worldly attachment. In marriage, these energies can create intense attraction, confusion, karmic bondage, obsession, emotional dissatisfaction, or spiritual awakening.

2.1 Astronomical Nature of Rahu and Ketu

Astronomically, Rahu and Ketu are not physical planets. They are the north and south lunar nodes formed by the intersection points of the Moon’s orbit with the ecliptic.

- Rahu is the North Node.

- Ketu is the South Node.

They are always placed exactly opposite each other in the horoscope. Their motion is retrograde, symbolizing karmic reversal and spiritual evolution. In astrology, Rahu magnifies worldly desires and material ambitions, whereas Ketu reduces attachment and pushes the native toward introspection.
